HEADTEACHER MESSAGE


"The greatest gift we can give our children are happy memories."



This morning in English, we have been completing our Traditional tale of Jack and the Beanstalk. Children have been adding their own adjectives and changing the character of the Giant in their version of the story.

Some examples are: He saw a wonderful beanstalk. It was a thundery, dark, shiny night, Jack was like a sleepy sloth.

In phonics the children have been looking at the long 'e' sound, e.g. speaking, sneezing, and peeping.

Children have also been focusing on contractions, e.g. cannot will then become can't, do not will then become don't.



In the news this week

The 2024 edition of the Guinness World Records has been released. This year, over 30,000 applicants submitted their achievements, but only 2,638 records were selected for the edition, which features more than 80% new and updated records. The annual collection of records has run since 1955, when it was first inspired by the question "What's the fastest game bird in Europe?". Its latest edition is themed around the Blue Planet, with a number of records celebrated, including those set by impressive marine creatures, adventurous sailors and record-breaking lakes, rivers and locescapes.


