Staff who were under confident in areas of the curriculum had access to these delivered by a professional which again led to self-confidence improving which impacted on raising standards in PE.</p> <p>This has allowed us to have access to a wide variety of sporting events and competitions. From this we have become a very competitive school and experienced success in various competitions this year. The KS2 football teams won both A and B leagues in winter and spring. The A team then went further to the regional finals played in Leeds. We also won the following events and competitions:</p>
